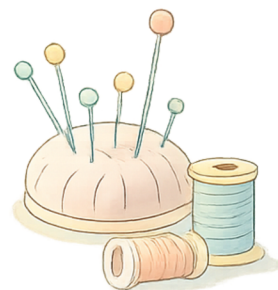

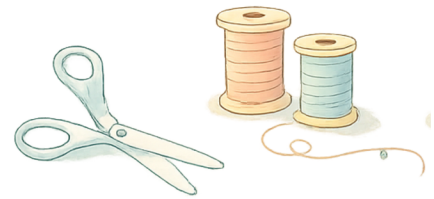
Your Creative Skills

Step 1: Identify Your Creative Strengths

Step 2: Think Like a Beginner

Great digital products often help beginners solve a small problem. Think about someone just starting your craft. What might they struggle with?

Example struggles:

- Choosing materials
- Learning basic stitches
- Starting their first project
- Understanding patterns
- Making a small project, etc.

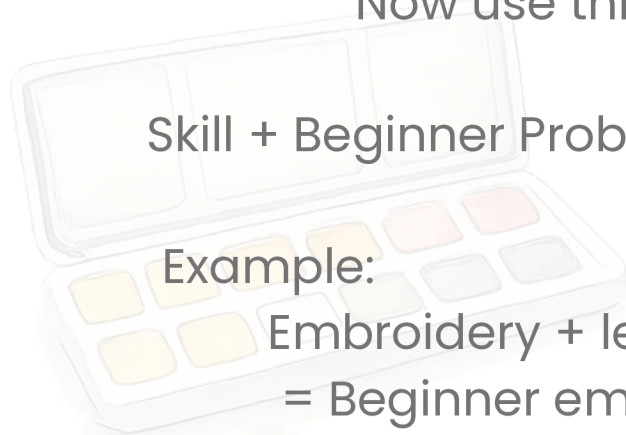

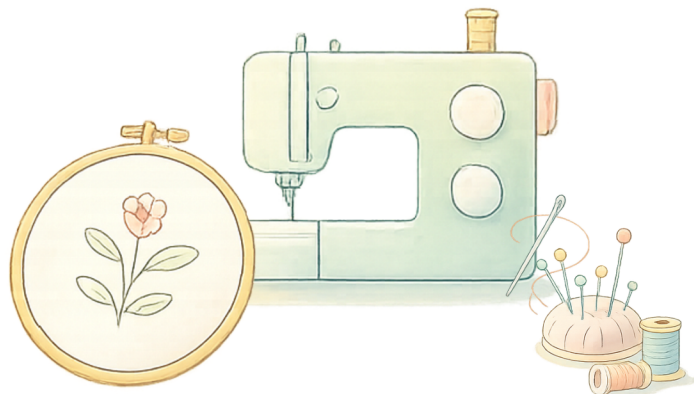
