

Reflection

Church in America.

The Spanish missions were harsh against the native culture of the Indians, but there were also very good things too, because of the grace of God. The desire of the Spanish missionaries was to give what is best to the natives. The way the missionaries did this was through giving the Indians a monastic way of life that they were to live, with prayer and work. The old habits of the Indians did not easily leave. The Spanish missions were also affected with the work of other forces and there were many people from Spain who wanted to gain wealth and to use the people for themselves. There was not a lot of respect towards the culture of the people. Because of this, the Spanish missions were not very successful. Because of God's grace, however, and Our Lady's prayers, many people converted to Christianity freely and the Catholic faith remained over a large part of the new world in America.

The French missions were different from the Spanish missions because the French missionaries who were more accepting of the native people. There was more understanding of their Indian culture, learning their language and working within their way of life. Saint Francois de Laval especially showed the way in this, along with other holy missionaries, from Quebec across now Canada and to Louisiana. The French missions made many conversions in the native peoples, and there was great success and a permanent effect to them. The French missionaries rejected beliefs of the American Indians that was against the Catholic faith, but they accepted the customs that were not against the faith.

The English missions in the new world began with the colony of the Maryland. This was among Protestants moving to the new world and attacks and persecutions between Catholics and Protestants from Europe. The Jesuits were some of the most important part of the English missions. Plantations were centers where Jesuits gave the sacraments and the teaching of St. Ignatius. This is some of the most important history for understanding the Catholic Church in the United States. In the English missions, freedom and tolerance came with sharing the faith, especially in Maryland.

Regulation for Great Lent

EPARCHY OF OUR LADY OF LEBANON OF LOS ANGELES REGULATION FOR GREAT LENT

Then to all Christ said, “Whoever wishes to be my follower, must deny his very self, take up his cross each day, and follow in my steps” (LK 9:23).

The Church has always helped us fulfill these words of Jesus by prescribing very definite penance for all Catholics. Accordingly, the Pope, the Patriarch and the American bishops have outlined obligatory fasting and abstinence. Our Eparchial Regulations are:

- **Great Friday (April 3, 2026)** is a day of *abstinence* for all Catholics over the age of 14. On this day, *fasting* as well as abstinence is also obligatory for those *from the age of 18 through 59*. Abstinence means abstinence from meat and meat products. Fasting means no food from midnight to noon, except for plain water. No Catholic will likely excuse himself or herself from this obligation.
- **All other Fridays of Lent** are days of *abstinence* from meat (and meat products) for everyone 14 years of age and older. Here again, Catholics will not hold themselves lightly excused.
- **If there is a serious health problem, the obligation of fasting and abstinence would not apply.**
- **Fasting from midnight to noon daily is optional.**
- **We strive to make all days of Lent a time of prayer, penance, and charitable assistance toward the less fortunate and needy.**





ALLOCATION OF FUNDS

Last year, we set a goal of \$260,000, which was allocated as outlined below. We raised a little over the goal amount, which helped defray the expenses of printing and mailing the Eparchial Appeal. We are truly grateful to all who generously contributed to support our Eparchy.

REPORT ON 2025 LENTEN APPEAL USE OF FUNDS (\$260,000)

* The funds raised are not sufficient to fully cover the expenses in various areas. The Eparchy continues to provide subsidies and address additional costs as necessary.

1. SEMINARIANS AND RETIRED PRIESTS

Our Eparchy is actively preparing two celibate seminarians and four married candidates for the Sacred Priesthood. Over the past year, the total expenses for their education, housing, formation, and living costs amounted to **\$283,618**. Additionally, we provide support for 10 retired priests, which incurs an annual cost of around **\$321,000**. **35% of this year's Annual Appeal proceeds will support Seminarians and Retired priests.**

2. MISSIONS AND AND SMALL PARISHES

Our Eparchy encompasses thirty-seven parishes and ten missions, serving over 46,000 Maronite Catholics across 34 states. Recently, we have established missions in New Orleans (LA) and Dallas (TX), as well as a plan to establish a new community in Mobile (AL). Many of these missions rely on financial assistance from the Eparchy to cover essential expenses. Your generous contributions will help us support these missions and connect with our cherished Maronite community throughout the country. **25% of this year's Annual Appeal proceeds will support Missions and Small Parishes.**
