The Brantley County Board of Commissioners held a work session on September 2, 2025, 6:00 PM, in the Commission Office.

Present were Chairman, Chris Harris, Board Members Hal Herndon, Brian Hendrix, Andy Riggins and Randy Davison. County Manager, Joey Cason and County Attorney, Steven Blackerby.

Chairman Harris called the meeting to order; Commissioner Riggins gave the invocation and led in the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

The County Manager asked the Board to amend the agenda to add 2 items:

1. Tess Aldridge- Satilla Advocacy
Ms. Aldridge was in attendance. She gave a quick update on services provided to local counties, including Brantley and how their services have benefited the residents of Brantley County.

2. Consideration of MOU- UGA Extension Office
Regular Agenda

3. Consideration of bids for office complex exterior remodel
Two bids were received. Warrior Builders for \$68,000 and M&M Builders for \$34,875. Regular Agenda

4. Consideration of the official New building name
Commissioners discussed and a recommendation was made to name the building "Brantley County Government Annex". Regular Agenda
5. Consideration of quotes for pickleball courts- Rec Department
Three quotes were received for 4 pickleball courts with lights. Talbot Tennis for \$154,486, Stewart Tennis for \$162,200, and Southeastern Tennis for \$193,131. Regular Agenda
6. Consideration of quotes for SCBA equipment- Hoboken VFD
The County Manager stated the purchase is for the amount of \$77,235.25 and would be compatible with the other fire departments' equipment. Regular Agenda

8. Consideration to purchase SCAG mower- Rec Department

Commissioner Hendrix made a motion to go into executive session. Commissioner Davison seconded the motion. All in favor. Motion carried.



The Brantley County Board of Commissioners held a regular meeting on September 4, 2025, at 6:00 PM, in the Commission Office.

Present were Chairman, Chris Harris, Board Members Hal Herndon, Brian Hendrix, Andy Riggins and Randy Davison, County Manager Joey Cason. County Attorney Steven Blackerby was not present.

Chairman Harris called the meeting to order; Ms. Mittie Vaughn gave the invocation and led in the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

Commissioner Davison made a motion to accept the August 2025 Minutes. Commissioner Hendrix seconded the motion. All in favor motion carried.

The County Manager made the recommendation to amend the agenda to add two items:

- 9A- consideration of MOU agreement with Purdue Pharma- Opioid settlement reimbursement
- 9B- Executive session- Personnel

Commissioner Riggins made a motion to approve the agenda. Commissioner Davison seconded the motion. All in favor. Motion carried

1. Consideration of MOU- UGA Extension Office

Commissioner Hendrix made a motion to approve. Commissioner Davison seconded the motion. All in favor. Motion carried

2. Consideration of bids for office complex exterior remodel

Commissioner Davison made a motion to approve the bid from M & M Builders for the exterior remodel at 33 Allen Road for a price of \$34,875. \$25,000 will be paid out of a budgeted line item, with the

remainder being paid from the Capital Projects Account.
Commissioner Hendrix seconded the motion. All in favor. Motion carried

3. Consideration of the official New building name

Commissioner Hendrix made a motion to officially name the new building the "Brantley County Government Annex". Commissioner Herdon seconded the motion. All in favor. Motion carried

4. Consideration of quotes for pickleball courts- Rec Department

Commissioner Hendrix made a motion to accept the bid from Talbot Tennis to build and light 4 new pickleball courts at the Recreation Sports Complex for a total of \$154,486. To be paid for out of 2019 SPLOST. Commissioner Davison seconded the motion. All in favor. Motion carried

5. Consideration of quotes for SCBA equipment- Hoboken VFD

After discussion on not receiving a total of 3 quotes.
Commissioner Herndon made a motion to table the item until two more quotes have been received. Commissioner Davison seconded the motion. All in favor. Motion carried.

6. Consideration of naming private easement located off Murphy Road- G.W. Farms Road.

Commissioner Hendrix made a motion to approve the naming of Private Easement off Murphy Road to G. W. Farms Road for 911 purposes. This will remain a private road. Commissioner Herndon seconded the motion. All in favor. Motion carried.

7. Consideration to purchase of SCAG mower- Rec Department

Commissioner Hendrix made a motion to approve the purchase of SCAG Turf Tiger II from Tait's Feed and Seed for a price of \$17,809. To be paid out of 2019 SPLOST. Commissioner Herndon seconded the motion. All in favor. Motion carried.

8. Consideration of agreement with INdigital Software- E911

Commissioner Herndon made a motion to approve final pricing for Motorola Vesta Equipment, INdigital 911 service and call routing and MEVO services that will allow offsite 911 capability for a total of \$495,552.48 over 5 years. Initial first year cost is \$169,238.93. Funds to be paid out of Capital Project Account. Commissioner Davison seconded the motion. All in favor. Motion carried.

9. Consideration of engineering agreement with CSX Railroad- Britt Still Road

Commissioner Davison made the motion to approve the engineering review agreement with CSX on Britt Sill paving project. This is to be paid out of 2019 Road SPLOST. Commissioner Hendrix seconded the motion. All in favor. Motion carried

9A. Consideration of MOU with Purdue Pharma

Commissioner Hendrix made a motion to approve the MOU with Purdue Pharma for Opioids settlement and all agreements with this settlement. Commissioner Davison seconded the motion. All in favor. Motion carried.

9B. Executive Session- Personell

Commissioner Riggins made a motion to go into executive session. Commissioner Hendrix seconded the motion. All in favor. Motion carried.

Reconvening after the Closed Session, Commissioner Hendrix made a motion to affirm matters discussed in Closed Session which was personnel, and directed the Chairman to sign the affidavit required by O.C.G.A. 50-14-4(b). Commissioner Herndon seconded the motion. All in favor. Motion carried.

Chairman Harris stated that information was received and no action taken.


10. Adjournment
