The Burgee Pole—Don Garrison

This month we'll discuss the next 12 burgees. Three of them might be said to be on the “A” list. That is, they are from Australia and Austria. We will get to them soon.

First up, Number 61 from Seabrook Sailing Club, Seabrook Texas. No other information as to who presented the burgee or whether there was an event involved.

Number 62 is from Conanicut Yacht Club, Jamestown, Rhode Island. There is nothing I could see on the hoist edge of the burgee.

Number 63 is our first international burgee this month. It is from the Sandringham Yacht Club, Sandringham, Victoria, Australia. There is no more information on this burgee.

Number 64 is from the Skaneateles Sailing Club, Skaneateles, New York. It was presented by Liz Eagan, but there's no date.

Number 65 is quite interesting. It is from the Roosevelt Roads Naval Base Yacht Club, Cielo, Puerto Rico. An Internet search found that the naval base closed in 2004, so the burgee must be older than that. It is an interesting pattern, with the orange item on it. Is it a stylized starfish, octopus, perhaps the sun? If you have any info about this one, I'd certainly like to hear it.

Number 66 is recorded as being from the Oklahoma City University Sailing Club, about as local as you can get.

Number 67 is from the Chicago Yacht Club, Chicago Illinois. No indication of who presented it or whether there was an event involved.

Numbers 68 and 69 are both from Austria. Whether they are from a member's vacation or represent two different trips, I have no idea. Number 68 is from the Union Yacht Club Wolfgangsee, St. Gilgen, Austria. Number 69 is from the Union Yacht Club Neusiedlersee, Vienna Austria. The burgee itself, as you can see, is quite tattered.

The final three are, Number 70, from Orleans Yacht Club, Orleans, MA; Number 71, from Dillon Yacht Club, Dillon, CO; and Number 72, Beverly Yacht Club, Marion, MA. Again I have no idea who presented these or whether there was an event involved.

That's all for this month. I will try to have another dozen next month. As always, if you know anything about the history of any of the club burgees, please let me know.





FROM THE DICTIONARY FOR LANDLUBBERS

Chip Log:


