This time of year is a little crazy with the changing/transitioning of leadership. I ask once more for patience and understanding until all the new leadership can get a grip on how the club is operated and their roll in the operations. I hope you all give Jay Collins, the new REAR COMMODORE, as much help and support if not more as you extended to me this last year.

As Vice Commodore i have several duties—one is to help and support Glede Holman as the new COMMODORE; second is to chair the Planning Committee; third is unwritten but it is to chair Lighthouse Charity, Inc. I will be reaching out to membership looking for interested members who would like to be part of the Planning Committee. If you want to be part of the future of the club please contact me.

Can you say **TRANSITION?** Well, that is what is going on with Lighthouse Charity, Inc. I was going to write something about it but it had already been written by our awesome Secretary Grady Logan last month (thanks, Grady!), but I feel it warrants reposting.

At several recent meetings, the board has considered changes to the Lighthouse Charity Incorporation documents and bylaws. The purpose of these changes is to establish greater autonomy and improved management of Lighthouse Charities. Before these changes were made, the Oklahoma City Boat Club Board of Governors served as the Board of Directors for Lighthouse. This has raised some questions about how independently Lighthouse Charities is actually managed. This policy also hinders long term planning and fund-raising efforts. As the OCBC board turns over every October, the Lighthouse board also changes, interrupting the ongoing operations of LCI. A summary of the most significant changes that were approved by the LCI board at its October meeting are as follows:

- The Lighthouse Board of Directors shall consist of at least 8 members, but not more than 13.
- At least half of the board members must be regular members of the Oklahoma City Boat Club. These directors will be selected by the incoming OCBC Board of Governors as soon as practical after the annual October Elections.
- The remaining members of the board shall not be OCBC members. These directors will be selected by the Boat Club's board and shall serve a three-year term.
- Vacancies in the LCI Board of Directors will be filled by action of the OCBC Board of Governors. When vacancies arise among the non OCBC members these shall be filled from candidates recommended by the Lighthouse Charity Board to OCBC Board of Governors.
- There are other changes that clarify the mission of LCI and support the restructuring of the Board of Directors.

As you can see, these changes make for more stable and independent management of Lighthouse Charities Incorporated. The Lighthouse Charity is doing great work promoting the sport of sailing, particularly among the youth of this area. Its programs are growing in reach and scope and these bylaw changes and the addition of a volunteer Managing Director will go a long way to supporting its continued success.

Summary of Minutes of BOG Meetings

The OCBC Board of Governors met Thursday, November 3. The transition of the board is going smoothly. The OCBC Board emails have been updated for the new board members making it easier for you to contact the appropriate board member by using the club email addresses. Please do not hesitate to contact your newly elected board!

Two new provisional members were presented to the board, Gary Mitchell and Jeffrey Kabelitz. Both were approved by the board and will be introduced to the general membership Thursday.

Carl Borgfeld reported to the board on the various ongoing grounds improvement projects. These include the work on C Dock, various concrete projects, gravel, and electrical switches for the youth shed, to name only a few. A new fire pit has been constructed in the youth area. Also, the installation of the air conditioning in the clubhouse has been completed. One issue of concern was discussed. Several people have raised concerns regarding traffic on the beach. Vehicles are creating ruts which are a safety hazard. Also, members are encouraged to take advantage of the low water level to clean up dock lines.

Other business discussed included the need for a long-term project planning committee to help prioritize and budget the long-term needs of the club. The recent restructuring of Lighthouse Charity Incorporation brings exciting changes allowing for greater involvement in the community.

Finally, the annual Banquet is scheduled for November 12. There are a limited number of tickets available.


