CLUB SAFETY AND LONG-TERM PLANNING

After the response from club members, SAFETY of the club (docks, decking and clubhouse) was the highest and the most expensive item.

I will be looking at some bids to replace our current wood and concrete deck. We feel it would best serve the club to install a new concrete deck with a special sealer to make it look good and prevent excess heat. The current wood walls-seating will be replaced with Trex wood products. To keep pricing down, the club will need to demolish the existing deck.

Another item that will be done over the winter will be in the clubhouse. That is the kitchen. Bringing the electrical and the kitchen exhaust system up to code will need to be attended to. We are seeking bids for these items. Both of these items are a big fire safety issue and affect our insurance.

Other long-term items that were brought up will be reviewed and brought to the board for consideration based on the cost and need.

We also realize that emergencies arise, and some of the projects that are on the list and some that are not on the list, may take priority over planned items. I would like to thank Shawn and Justin for their help.

Another item that has come up is the club's committee boat usage. Some of you may not know all the items that need to be checked before taking them out on the water. The OCBC board will put on a power boat safety and maintenance class this fall after the racing season is over to further educate you and prevent accidents or damage to the club's property. A date and time will be announced at a later date.




