

**THE SEPTEMBER MEMBERSHIP MEETING  
NEEDS THE ATTENDANCE OF ALL MEMBERS  
ELIGIBLE TO VOTE  
Amendments to the Constitution and Bylaws  
to allow Absentee Ballot voting**

The Membership Committee was unable to have a vote on members requesting to change status, such as Provisionals who had completed their requirements or other members requesting to move to Regular membership for lack of a quorum for the June and July meetings when we usually have more than 40 regular members. Many of you may remember the Board was asked at July meeting to come up with a way for us to have a vote at the meeting.

**Thanks to all of you who came to the August meeting so we could vote on the Membership Committee's ballots.**

**We need you to come to the September meeting for an important vote.**

In light of this challenge, and the bigger one for the election at the October meeting, when we may have to start meeting indoors due to the weather, the Board approved amendments that were proposed at the August membership meeting. These amend the Constitution and Bylaws to give the board the discretion to approve the use of absentee ballot voting as well as including members voting by absentee and/or attending and voting by e-communication voting, in addition to those attending the meeting in person to constitute a quorum.

The Board has conditionally approved the Annual Election meeting in October as our first time to allow Absentee Ballot Voting by paper ballot only and approved the procedure to be used to implement this if the membership approves the amendments at the September meeting. Going forward, the Board must approve paper absentee ballot and/or e-communication voting each time.

We need you to attend so we have a quorum to vote on this important change to our Constitution and Bylaws. The meeting is scheduled to be outside on the porch with masks recommended, and if weather moves us inside, masks will be mandatory with some available to those who don't have a mask. See the article inside for more information regarding this important vote.

# Amendments Proposed At The August Meeting To Be Voted On At The September Meeting

Those who attended the August Meeting heard the amendments to the Constitution and Bylaws which were proposed after approval by the Board of Governors. Most of these amendments relate to the changes needed to allow Absentee Ballot voting as well as allowing those votes and/or attendance by Zoom or other electronic methods to be counted towards the number of 40 regular members needed to constitute a quorum. These amendments do **not** change the number of regular members needed for a quorum, but redefine how such number can be counted if the Board approves the meeting to include those attending electronically and/or those who vote by absentee ballot.

Below is the full text of the motions as well as the language in the respective sections needed to give them some context where appropriate. There were some other “clean up” changes that change our Bylaws to include several assumptions or traditional ways we’ve handled club business through the years. These include use of Roberts Rules of Order when our Bylaws don’t have a specific provision, formalizing the use of the latest e-mail and/or mailing address of a member to notify such member, and expanding the approved person who has the authority to make necessary technical and typographical changes to the Bylaws.

These proposed Amendments will be submitted as 2 votes – one for all the provisions needed to amend the Constitution and Bylaws to allow absentee ballot voting and how a quorum may be determined with approval by the Board of Governors. The other vote will be the provisions that are “clean up.”

The Board of Governors approved these changes which should allow our club be able to hold our annual election of officers and other votes on the ballot during the Annual Election Meeting in October. They anticipate that absentee ballot votes and in-person eligible votes will total at least 40 regular members, the number needed to constitute a quorum.

The motions to be put on the floor for discussion (no amendments permitted) and vote are as follows:

I, Ann Kilpatrick, with approval by the Board of Governors, move to amend the Constitution and Bylaws of The Oklahoma City, Boat Club, Inc. as follows:

**I. A.** to amend Article VII, Quorum, of the Constitution by inserting " , however absentee ballot voting and/or e-communication voting may be permitted as set forth in Article \_\_\_\_\_ of the Bylaws and when permitted, valid absentee ballots and/or e-communication attendance and ballots may be included to constitute a quorum." after A quorum for the transaction of business of this club shall be forty (40) Regular Members and no quorum may be constituted nor voting be permitted by proxy in Article VII, Quorum, Section 1 [so that Article VII shall read as follows:

## **Article VII, Quorum**

**Section 1.** A quorum for the transaction of business of this club shall be forty (40) Regular Members and no quorum may be constituted nor voting be permitted by proxy, however absentee ballot voting and/or e-communication voting may be permitted as set forth in Article \_\_\_\_\_ of the Bylaws and when permitted, valid absentee ballots and/or e-communication attendance and ballots may be included to constitute a quorum.]

**B.** to amend Article IV, Election of Officers of the Bylaws by inserting "provided however, absentee ballot votes and/or e-communication voting may be permitted at the discretion of, and with the approval of the Board of Governors as provided in Article \_\_\_\_\_, Absentee Ballot Voting and E-communication Voting" after Voting shall be by secret ballot cast at the Annual Meeting [so that Article IV, Election of Officers, Section 3 shall read as follows:

#### **ARTICLE IV, Election of Officers**

**Section 3.** Voting shall be by secret ballot cast at the Annual Meeting, provided however, absentee ballot votes and/or e-communication voting may be permitted at the discretion of, and with the approval of the Board of Governors as provided in Article \_\_\_\_\_, Absentee Ballot Voting and E-communication Voting". The candidate for each office receiving the majority of votes cast shall be declared elected. In the event there are three (3) or more candidates nominated for any office and no candidate receives a majority of the votes cast on the first ballot, then the two candidates receiving the greatest number of votes shall be voted upon and the candidate receiving the majority of votes cast shall be declared elected.]

**C.** to amend the Bylaws by adding Article XI, Absentee Ballot Voting and E-communication Voting as follows:

#### **Article XI, Absentee Ballot Voting and E-communication Voting**

**Section 1.** All Regular Members may be given the right to vote by absentee ballot or e-communication on any vote by the membership relating to slated elections, any amendments to the Bylaws or Constitution or any other issues when such method or methods of voting are deemed necessary and approved by the Board of Governors. Such absentee ballot, signed and dated by the Regular Member, should be given to the Bylaws Chair, Committee Chair whose committee is responsible for the tally of such ballots, or other person designated by the Board of Governors by the deadline communicated in the notice provided, and in any event, no later than call to order of the Membership meeting at which the vote will be taken by those attending the meeting.

**Section 2.** The official absentee ballot may be obtained electronically, or from the person designated by the Board of Governors to distribute the paper absentee ballots.

**Section 3.** Absentee ballot votes on a specific issue are void if the specific issue is amended during the meeting and such void ballots would not be included to constitute a quorum.

**Section 4.** Absentee ballots do not count toward quorum, provided however, in the event of a global, national, state or local disaster, or when deemed necessary and approved by the Board of Governors, valid absentee ballots may be included to constitute a quorum upon approval by the Board of Governors for a regular club meeting.

**Section 5.** E-communication voting may be permitted when deemed necessary and approved by the Board of Governors. The Board of Governors shall designate one Regular Member, preferably the Secretary or Committee Chairman responsible for tallying the ballots, to monitor the e-communicated votes.

**II. A.** to amend Section 2 of ARTICLE X, Amendments by adding "Bylaws Chairman/Parliamentarian or other Regular Member designated and approved by the Board of Governors" after The Secretary [so that Article X, Amendments, Section 2 shall read as follows:

#### **ARTICLE X, Amendments**

**Section 2.** The Secretary "Bylaws Chairman, Parliamentarian or other Regular Member designated and approved by the Board of Governors" shall have the authority to make necessary technical and typographical changes to the Bylaws in order to assure editorial continuity with substantive changes approved by the Board of Governors and the membership.]

**B.** to amend ARTICLE X, Amendments by adding Section 3. Rules of Order, and Section 4, Notice, as follows:

*"Section 3. Rules of Order. Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised (current edition) shall by the parliamentary authority for all matters of procedure not specifically covered by the Constitution, these Bylaws or by specific rules or procedures adopted by The Oklahoma City Boat Club, Inc.*

*"Section 4. Notice. Any notice required under the Constitution, Bylaws or any Policies and Procedures of this club shall be deemed to be received by the member upon deposit in the U.S. Mail or through an official The Oklahoma City Boat Club, Inc. email properly addressed to the member at the address or email address listed in the current records of The Oklahoma City Boat Club, Inc. as specified in each section of the Bylaws."*

[so that ARTICLE X, Amendments shall read as follows:

#### **ARTICLE X, Amendments**

**Section 1.** These bylaws may be amended by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the Regular Members present and voting at a regular meeting, provided that the proposed amendment or amendments shall have been proposed at a preceding meeting, and shall have been posted on the club bulletin board for at least twenty-eight (28) days preceding the meeting at which the vote is to be taken.

**Section 2.** The Secretary, Bylaws Chairman, Parliamentarian, or other Regular Member designated and approved by the Board of Governors shall have the authority to make necessary technical and typographical changes to the Bylaws in order to assure editorial continuity with substantive changes approved by the Board of Governors and the membership.

**Section 3. Rules of Order.** Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised (current edition) shall by the parliamentary authority for all matters of procedure not specifically covered by the Constitution, these Bylaws or by specific rules or procedures adopted by The Oklahoma City Boat Club, Inc.

**Section 4. Notice.** Any notice required under the Constitution, Bylaws or any Policies and Procedures of this club shall be deemed to be received by the member upon deposit in the U.S. Mail or through an official The Oklahoma City Boat Club, Inc. email properly addressed to the member at the address or email address listed in the current records of The Oklahoma City Boat Club, Inc. as specified in each section of the Bylaws.]

**C.** to amend the title of ARTICLE X, Amendments of the Bylaws to "ARTICLE X, Amendments, Rules of Order, and Notice" [so that the title of Article X shall include the title of Sections 3 and 4 as the amendments to this Article are amended


Hello OCBC members.

## Board of Governor's Meeting—AUGUST 6, 2020

The monthly meeting of the OCBC Board of Governors was called to order at 1900 hrs on Thursday, September 3rd and a quorum was present. The minutes of the August 6th meeting were read, amended for errors, and approved. Nominating Committee Chair, Chris Bayouth, presented the slate of candidates for elected office and a discussion took place on absentee voting procedure in the event the Motion to adopt absentee voting in special circumstances, discussed at the last general membership meeting, is passed.



Membership Committee Chair, Liz Eagan discussed new members and requested the board to approve those members who are eligible for Annual Honorary membership status. a motion for that was made, seconded and the motion carried.

Richard Walford presented the Treasurer's Report. A motion to accept was made and seconded and the motion carried. Richard went on to discuss a new online payment portal, which should simplify online dues payments. A motion to switch to this new platform was made, seconded and the motion carried.

He reminded the board there are still numerous boats out of State and Local registration requirement and encourage everyone to help rectify the issue.

Maiden crew member and professional sailor, Dawn Riley, will be on hand for a question and answer session on women in sailing, the Maiden experience, professional sailing and the state of our sport immediately before the movie. # AMERICA'S CUP 2020 UPDATE

## America's Cup: Her name is Patriot (2nd AC75)

American Magic, Challenger for the 36th America's Cup took delivery of its second AC75 in Auckland, NZ, named Patriot, which will succeed the team's current AC75, Defiant. The team is expected to use the new vessel to compete in the following upcoming regattas: America's Cup World Series, Auckland (December 17-20), the Prada Cup (the Challenger Finals: January 15-22, 2021), and the 36th America's Cup sponsored by Prada (March 6-21, 2021), if American Magic wins the Prada Cup.

During the current America's Cup cycle, American Magic was the first among the challenger teams to launch a full-size test boat, "The Mule", in October 2018. Then, eleven months later, they were the first to sail and foil on an AC75, subsequent to launching Defiant. With Patriot, the first second generation challenger AC75 to arrive in Auckland, after a 900-mile journey by aircraft, American Magic will now be able to maximize testing time on the water prior to the opening regatta.

## EDITOR'S EPILOGUE—Keith Green
