



**We need a quorum in attendance (Regular Member *or* Regular Member's spouse may vote) at the July 14 Membership Meeting to be able to vote on the OCBC Bylaws Amendments proposed by the Leadership Development Task Force.**

Many of you know that I am in the hospital recovering from a serious workplace event that happened on June 30. I thank and appreciate all the well wishes from so many OCBC members. We were not able to hold the third Town Hall meeting on June 30 and I will not be in attendance at the July 14 Membership Meeting. It is my strong desire, and I have authorized the Leadership Development Task Force ("LDTF"), to move forward with the vote that is scheduled for the July 14 membership meeting for those who can attend and vote in person.

I regret that I can't be with you for this important vote for our club, but want this project by the LDTF to move forward as originally scheduled. I also want to thank everyone on the Task Force for their hard work *as well as* those who came to the two Town Hall Meetings in May. Everyone helped LDTF come up with the proposed amendments that we think are closer to the way we've been doing most things, enlarging some privileges to all classes of membership and changes consistent with what many members thought were already the bylaws provisions. A copy of the proposed amendments to the Bylaws is available on the OCBC website in the Members Only area (p/w is on your membership card) or you may contact Ann Kilpatrick to email you a copy of it.

The Board of Governors has approved absentee voting which can be done electronically or by paper ballot, however absentee ballots *will not* count towards obtaining a quorum, so please attend the meeting in person if at all possible.

Depending on your preference, Grady will send you a paper ballot or a link where you can vote - your voting where the link directs you will let Grady know that you have completed the process. Your actual vote will be sent to whomever is designated to receive the electronic votes.

If you want a paper ballot, it should be requested as early as possible to allow sufficient time to return it before the meeting Thursday night which you should mail back or return to Grady Logan in person. If it is not received by Thursday in the club's post office box or returned in person, you (or your spouse) can still vote in person on July 14, but any ballot received after the 14<sup>th</sup> will not be counted.

Again, my thanks to all who worked on this monumental project.

I look forward to rejoining you as soon as I can.

## Leadership Development Task Force Report for Thursday, July 14 Vote by the Membership

In March, the Leadership Development Task Force (LDTF) chaired by Chris Bayouth, who is also the Nominating Chairman (and chaired last year's Membership Development Task Force), began meeting to review many provisions of the Bylaws, most of which affect movement between membership classifications that were brought by the Membership Committee to the Board in March, 2020, which referred the changes to the Bylaws Committee. There were some differences of opinion so the LDTF decided it was the best place to start its task.

After several meetings, the LDTF was ready to present its recommendations and ask for input from members before finalizing the proposed amendments. Two Town Hall meetings on May 24 and May 31 had light attendance after posting the changes in a document on the "Members Only" section of the OCBC website, but quite a few minor changes brought up at those meetings were incorporated into the document that was presented at the June 9, 2022, Membership meeting. The LDTF placed the proposed amendments on the floor at the Thursday, June 9, 2022, Membership Meeting for discussion and as there were no amendments, the document with proposed amendments was posted on the west bulletin board and website as the final draft so ready to be voted on. Due to a workplace incident Chris Bayouth was unable to attend the 3rd Town Hall meeting on Thursday, June 30, so it was cancelled. Although Chris is unable to attend the July 14 meeting, he had gotten approval by the Board for absentee ballots, and strongly desires that the membership vote on the amendments at the July 14 membership meeting.

As it is a lengthy document, it has been posted on the "Members Only" section of the OCBC website since shortly after the June 9 meeting, but will not be printed in Ye Logge nor attached and sent to our members only e-mail list that isn't up to date at this time. Each proposed amendment has the (1) provision as it is now, (2) "red-lined" version of the proposed amendment(s), (3) the way the provision(s) will read if the amendment(s) are approved by the membership, along with a (4) brief description of the rationale for the changes. Most of the changes are to bring our Bylaws in line with what the membership's perception already were, to be more consistent about movement of membership classification, and codify procedures that have been used though inconsistent with the provisions in the Bylaws.

We encourage you to look at the proposed amendments before the club meeting this Thursday (7/14) and feel free to call, text or e-mail someone on the LDTF if you have any questions or want a copy to review sent to you. And of course, my huge appreciation and thanks to those who were able to come to one or more of the LDTF or Town Hall meetings with thoughtful discussion and suggestions.
