Low water has made it easier for non-members to gain access around our fencing. Please report anything you see out of the ordinary or anything you suspect. We continue to have problems with the clubhouse being left unsecure. Please make sure you lock up when you leave.

Thanks to the efforts of our Race Committee Chair, regular weekly racing has returned and we will continue as long as we can. I look forward to seeing you on the water and/or around the club.

VICE-COMMODORE—Jay Collins

A few months ago we had a long-term planning meeting at the boat club. It was great to get feedback from our members. Justin Howard and Shawn Cina have created a list of items that came out of the meeting, itemizing the list in categories of need based on what you would like to see updated or changed.

Items:

Safety of the club (docks, decking and clubhouse safety) was the highest and the most expensive items. Other items that were brought up will be listed in order of importance (RC boats, marks, racing needs, member boat usage, kitchen updates, windows, dock water, clubhouse, playground equipment, exterior, signage, clubhouse floors and walls, and fencing.)

We will be putting this information on the OCBC web site for you to see, and there will be an area for you to mark what is important to you. We need your input. Once that is done, we will tally your input and of wants/needs. Pricing estimates will be obtained and a time frame on when we might expect some of these projects may be done. The long-term planning committee will present the board what projects we can do based on needs, price and when they should be done. Some of the larger projects may have to be split up in multiple years due to their costs (docks and seawall repairs) and covered by our capital funds. Some of the smaller projects might be covered under our yearly operations budget. Please note that we only have so much money that can be used each year and we cannot get all of it done at once. Once the board reviews the projects and makes their recommendations, they will present them to OCBC members. A lot of these projects will need a vote of the member for approval.

We also realize that some emergencies can come up and some of the projects that are on the list and some that are not on the list may take priority over planned items. I would like to thank Shawn and Justin for their help in putting the list together. **Now** it is your (members) turn to give us your input so we can move forward.

The next work party is scheduled for this Saturday, June 10. We will begin at 8:00am. We will be gearing up for Lighthouse and the Hobie Nationals. We have several projects to complete and need a lot of help to get it all done. Some of the projects include cleaning the outside of the clubhouse and porch, deep cleaning the inside of the clubhouse, cleaning and organizing the centerboard shed, removing volunteer trees and bushes from around the property and other gardening needs, fixing the fence, continue repairing dock and dock safety. **Supplies recommended:** screw drivers, saws, brooms, heavy duty rake (gravel and sand), lopping shears, shovels, post hole diggers, sawzalls, come-alongs, wire cutters, etc.

This is our first summer to have air conditioning. We are working hard to find the balance of maximizing the efficiency of the air conditioners with energy usage. In other words, how we can stay comfortable without having a huge electric bill? The mini split air conditioning units in the kitchen are very energy efficient. In fact, they use less energy than the large fans we have used in the past. Currently, these two units are on a schedule for 74 degrees on Tuesday - Saturday evenings as well as Tuesday mornings. We will adjust the programming for special events and regattas. If the air conditioners are running, please keep the door and windows closed. Additionally, the air conditioners also help reduce humidity.

Friendly Reminder: All City and Lake Permits need to be kept current. State permits expire at the end of the month.

The Member of the Month is Dan Endres for his help with many, many projects including dock and patio repairs and his harrowing work removing the dead branch above the patio.

As always, if you see a problem or concern at the club, please let me know as soon as possible so I can address it quickly.

We had 11 people complete their capsized drill on Saturday, June 3. The capsized drill is required every year so that sailors can use the centerboard LCI boats. I am happy to say that everyone passed and were good sports about getting in the chilly water. I highly recommend coming to the yoga classes on Friday nights (see more info below) to enhance upper body strength to facilitate righting and getting back up on the boat for the drill and especially when you are out on the lake.
