



How can I be involved in Lighthouse Charities, Inc.?

There are several ways that individuals and businesses can be involved in the ongoing success of Lighthouse Charities, Inc. (“LCI”). LCI is a 501(c)(3) organization which means it is tax exempt (i.e. exempt from federal and state income taxes) as well as tax deductible so donations are deductible by the donor.

Donations are primarily solicited in conjunction with the annual Lighthouse Charity Regatta (“LCR”) which is in June each year. This year’s 22nd annual event includes 1-day regatta with Centerboard & Multihull races on Saturday, June 18, followed by the Lake Hefner Challenge Cup races and a 2-day regatta for Keel-boat races on June 25-26. LCI accepts cash, check, credit card donations which may be done online on the website at www.okclighthouse.org.

Deadlines for being included in the event donor recognition opportunities are May 15 for the event T-shirt with names/logos on the back side, and June 1 for the event board on the outside west wall of the clubhouse. Donor Agreements are available in the clubhouse and on the LCI website.

If you work for an employer that has a foundation, or matching gifts program for its employees, please consider including Lighthouse as an organization that qualifies for your employer’s program. Some employers also provide for their employees to have charitable deductions taken out of their paychecks throughout the year. Some employer foundations also have grants available to be applied for from time to time. Please contact the Vice Commodore if you want Lighthouse to follow up and contact the community outreach person in your employer’s office for a corporate donation, or to apply for a grant as it may require some financial and other information.

Other ways to be involved in Lighthouse include being a volunteer during one or both weekends during the regattas. Volunteers are needed on the Race Committee, helping with meals and clean-up in and around the clubhouse.

During the camps, adult volunteers can help when the youth participants are not out on the sailboats as well as going on a safety boat. Please contact our Head Coach, Lynn Pinegar at lpinegar@sbcglobal.net if you are interested in helping during the summer camps.

The Steering Committee that plans the annual regatta meets monthly, usually on the 3rd Thursday of each month at 1830 hours. They welcome volunteers to join the meetings and become involved in the various committees that make the event a success.

At the last two meetings of the Board of Governors, in April and in May, we discussed replacing the clubhouse windows and the installation of air conditioning. Each of these projects will entail significant cost and effort. So, we are considering each of these proposals separately. Several vendors have provided scope of work documents with detailed quotations of the cost. More quotations are being sought. We want to make sure that we have the best proposal for the club before any decisions are made.

The basic plan for the air conditioning envisions three separate units, one large unit for the primary clubhouse space and two smaller units to be installed in zones where spot cooling is likely to be required. The large unit is a conventional ducted system. It has been determined by all vendors after their inspections that our current duct work is adequate for providing cool air. All proposals also include replacing our very old furnace. The small zone cooling units are split ductless units like the unit that is used to cool the boardroom. The current plan is to keep the clubhouse at a higher maintenance temperature and only reduce the thermostat setting when events are scheduled.

Replacing the windows is a more complicated task as many of our windows are nonstandard. The large windows at the corners of the building also provide a considerable challenge. These special windows will have to be constructed to fit our window openings. Given the current and supply chain issues we have been told to expect delivery in eighteen weeks after the construction drawings have been approved. And to further complicate the issue and increase the cost is the likely use of lead-based paint on the old construction.

This article is only meant to bring to your attention some of the business before the board. By no means is this article expected to raise or answer all of the questions that you might have.



Lighthouse Charities, Inc.

The Oklahoma City Boat Club (OCBC) formed Lighthouse Charities, Inc. ("LCI") in 2001 to provide charitable activities to the Oklahoma City community. It is a 501(c)(3) tax deductible public charity. During its first 15 years, it distributed most of the annual regatta proceeds to other 501(c)(3) organizations in the greater Oklahoma City community. For the last 7 or more years, LCI has provided scholarships for underserved children in the OKC community to attend one or more week-long summer youth sailing camps held at OCBC.



Little Light Christian School, Boys and Girls Club, Peppers Ranch and Single Parent Support Network were some of the organizations awarded scholarships in 2019. Each organization selects children in their programs to attend. In 2020 and 2021, attendance was lower due to COVID-19. The camp also provides incentives for children to learn to swim, as it is a requirement to participate in the sailing camps. This year LCI expects scholarship participants from OKC Public School STEM program, Little Light Christian School, Peppers Ranch, Calm Waters and Police Athletic League.

The sailing camp is open to the public and available to children interested in learning to sail whether or not their family belongs to OCBC. Adult lessons are also available. In 2021, LCI purchased 10 new RS Zest dinghies to replace our Pico fleet for training boats.



LCI also has a fleet of 420s used primarily by collegiate teams and to host our annual collegiate regatta in October.



LCI is volunteer-run as the only paid employees are youth sailing coaches and instructors who run the summer camps during June, July and August.

Registration for the summer camps, adult lessons and other information about can be found on LCI's website at www.okclighthouse.org.

Adult volunteers are needed to assist during the sailing camps.

As set forth in LCI's Certificate of Incorporation, its purposes are exclusively for educational or charitable purposes, including: (a) to award need-based scholarship, grant, and/or other forms of financial support to sailors of all ages and skill levels to participate in sailing-related activities and/or programs; (b) to promote and present sailing regattas and/or other sailing-related activities to promote community participation in the Corporation's charitable fundraising, giving and educational efforts and programs; (c) to support and provide sailing programs, sailing activities and opportunities to learn, volunteer and connect with the local sailing community that are accessible to the general public; (d) to conduct youth sailing programs and activities accessible to youth in the community as one method of combating juvenile delinquency; (e) to mentor potential candidates to participate in regional, national, international and/or Olympic competition.

OCBC has hosted many prestigious regattas including regional and national championships which are listed on its website. In 2008 alone, LCI co-hosted the Catalina 25 National Championship, Flying Scot Wife-Husband Championship, San Juan 21 North American Championship and Adams Cup U.S. Women's National Championship. LCI has also hosted the Santana 20 Nationals in 2011, Catalina 22 Nationals in 2019, and the VX One North American Championship in 2021.

LCI planned to host the U. S. Junior Women's Doublehanded Championship ("Ida Lewis") in July, 2020. Unfortunately, this event was cancelled by U.S. Sailing for 2020 and 2021.

Other than monies raised for national championship regattas, most LCI funding is raised from the proceeds of the Lighthouse Charity Regatta ("LCR"), LCI's annual benefit regatta. The 2022 Regatta will be held on June 25-26. The Lake Hefner Challenge Cup event will be held June 18 with each boat having a minimum of \$500 in donations to participate and will start after the races for our 1-day Centerboard & Multihull Regatta. A dinner with entertainment will follow.

There are several ways to contribute, including cash donations, in-kind donations, and regatta participation either as an individual or a (sponsored) team. *LCI provides a thank you letter and tax receipt documenting your deductible contribution. See the Donor Agreement or LCR Registration and Donation areas of the website at www.okclighthouse.org.*

The new facility for the youth/LCI and centerboard sailing program is now finished. Please consider making a donation for the building, new RS Zest fleet of boats or ongoing programs.

Please consider participating in the Lake Hefner Challenge Cup ("LHCC"). This year's event is the same format we had in 2019 and several previous years.

After the races each weekend on Saturday &/or Sunday, there will be refreshments, presentation of the LHCC trophy to the winning team (6/18) and dinner hosted by Vice Commodore Glede and Teresa Holman at OCBC/ LCI. Tickets for dinner (6/25) and T-shirts will be available for sale in June and may be pre-ordered online.



This is a wonderful opportunity to learn how much fun sailing can be while participating in a regatta that serves a good cause. It can also be a good team experience.

SOS (Spread Our Scholarships) update

Lighthouse Charities, Inc. wants your input and help!

The past few years have been challenging for the Lighthouse Charities, Inc. as it pertains to awarding scholarships to attend our summer youth sailing camp. After some evaluation we are poised to re-invigorate and revamp our program to include some new organizations and to seek out children who would benefit from our scholarships and receive enrichment that would help in their future endeavors.

We have a great relationship and success with Little Light Christian School that has been a beneficiary of both cash distributions and scholarships. Both were very gratefully received and we anticipate they will participate this summer. In previous years, we have also worked with Pepper's Ranch and reached out to OKC Boys & Girls Club and Calm Waters resulting in mixed participation due to logistics and Covid. This year, we've reached out to OKC Schools STEM program (see flyer), Little Light Christian School, Pepper's Ranch and Calm Waters and Cliff Holman is working with Police Athletic League to see if they can also send some youth. Both Calm Waters ('03 and '04) and PAL ('01) were beneficiaries of cash distributions in the earlier years of Lighthouse so it's nice to be able to continue to offer them assistance for their youth programs.

In order to qualify for some of the corporate donations, LCI doesn't operate as a "pass through" in its fundraising as it had in the first 10 years. These donors are enthusiastic to help our program by donating to provide a fund for scholarships to attend the actual camp.

Going forward, we are looking to award more scholarships to students, preferably middle school-age kids who are interested in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math). We are looking for students who would benefit and find true enjoyment in sailing who would not have the opportunities otherwise. They must be able to swim and get transportation to and from camp. We also ask that they provide their own lunch but if there is a need we will address it on a case by case basis.

We have had many success stories of kids growing up in our youth program (both club kids and non-members) who have credited their sailing experiences as part of their success in future work, college and life choices. Helping kids access sailing as a lifelong pastime benefits our club, its future and creates a lasting legacy we can be proud of.
