Payment Options

If both payment attempts are unsuccessful, the student's account may be temporarily disabled until the past-due balance is resolved. To restore access, the outstanding tuition balance and a \$20 reactivation fee must be paid in full.

Course Descriptions

The following course descriptions provide an overview of subjects offered through Tabernacle Bible College & Seminary. Courses are listed by subject area and course number. Course offerings, sequencing, and availability may be updated by the school as needed.

All Church History (ACH)

ACH 101 — Church History

This is a study of the life of Christ, the life of Paul and a synopsis of the book of Acts.

Biblical Language (BLT)

BLT 501 — Greek 1

A basic instruction of New Testament Greek with emphasis on reading actual text.

BLT 510 — Hebrew 1

A basic instruction of Biblical Hebrew.

Biblical Mentoring (BM)

BM 301 — Restoring the Foundations

This book will aid every believer in breaking the curses and failures past and walk in the "Eternal Realm "as the Lord intended.

BM 302 — Regaining and Identifying your Identity

This course will help you take great strides in regaining and recognizing who you really are and who God intended you to be.

Biblical Studies BS

BS 101 — General Bible Knowledge

This course covers Origin of the Bible, Customs & languages and The Dateless Past.

BS 102 — Geological Ages

A Study of Earth's First Social Order.

BS 201 — Eschatology

A closer study of end time events including the Advent of Christ, Daniel's Seventieth Week, the Seven Trumpet Judgments, Seven Vails, Battle of Armageddon, Anti-Christ, Tribulation period and Millennial Reign of Christ.

BS 302 — Church As It Was

A look at current events and thoughts of the church in the 18th, 19th and 20th centuries.

BS 303 — Prophecy

This course gives an in-depth look at the Gift of Prophecy and the prophetic ministry.

BS 304 — World Religions & Their Place in History

A look into past established religions, religious beliefs and how history was shaped by these beliefs.

BS 305 — The Royal Priesthood

A study of the O.T. Priesthood, its influence and culmination with the ministry of Christ.

Christian Doctrine (CD)

CD 101 — Ages/Dispensations

A study of the ages or divisions of time in which God used different methods in the great work of redeeming man from his fallen state. This includes a study of the age of Innocence, Conscience, Human Government, Promise, Law, Grace and the Kingdom. Also covered is the concept of earth's seven cosmic ages: Original Earth, Chaotic earth, Edenic Earth, Shielded Earth, Turbulent Earth, Millennial Earth, and New Earth.

CD 102 — Covenants

The course provides an in-depth revelation of the Power, Blessing, and Responsibility of Covenant.

CD 103 — Humanism vs. Godhead

This course provides in-depth insight into the Nature & Character of Jehovah, ruling out the modern theory of Humanism.

CD 104 — Soteriology

A study of the doctrine of atonement and salvation as affected by Christ, embracing all of time as well as eternity past and future.

CD 105 — Angelic Beings & The Underworld

This is a study of angelology and demonology, including the origin, work and ultimate disposition of fallen angels and satan himself, as presented in Scripture.

CD 201 — Apologetics

An intense study of the defense and proof of Christianity.

CD 202 — Tripartation of Man

This is a study of the body, soul and spirit of man, and the function of each.

CD 203 — Foundational Theology

Some of the greatest discussions in theological history will be studied and criticized. These topics include apologetics, Anabaptists, Arminianism, Calvinism, anthropomorphism, etc.

Also included is a study of the theology as taught by Paul, reconciliation and glorification, and a study of the work of an evangelist and the implications of the Great Commission.

CD 204 — Ungodly Beliefs vs. Godly Belief System

A study of the beliefs formed by our surroundings vs. the Word of God.

CD 205 — Principles of Kingdom Living

The plans and philosophies of living the life our Father destined and designed. We either live by "design or default".

CD 206 — The Five Ministry Offices or Gifts

This course defines in simple form what each of these important gifts are to the body of Christ and helps those who are called to recognize their gift.

CD 207 — Thanatology

This is the study of the resurrections of the just and the unjust, the doctrine of death, dying, and the afterlife. It discusses infanticide, euthanasia, and issues of the aged or those facing terminal illness.

CD 301 — Hermeneutics

An in-depth study in the principles and processes of Biblical interpretation.

CD 302 — Managing Market Place Ministry/Conflict Resolution

This course provides strategies and Leadership Insights to effective leadership and gives explicit avenues to solving conflict. Ministry is ministry, whether in businesses or the Church building.

CD 303 — Assignment for Success

An in-depth study of the assignment of every believer to accomplish and fulfill their Divinely Destined Purpose in life, showing & revealing the favorable results of God's plan.

CD 305 — Unveiling Spiritual Warfare

This course is an introduction to the effect spiritual warfare has on the Kingdom of darkness

CD 306 — The Theology of Binding and Loosing

In this course we will unveil a deeper meaning of Mathew 16:18 and the power of Authority given to the believer to "Remove the hand of the enemy from what belongs to us and Bind the Promise of God in place".

CD 507 — Sacramental Theology

A study of the role of the sacraments in Christian worship.

CD 519 — Ecclesiology

Description & Identity of The Church. An intense study of the church and its mission, nature, and present work. It includes a historical look at the church and its early development.

Christian Philosophy (CP)

CP 101 — Doctrine & Person of Holy Spirit

A study of the person, power and ministry of Holy Spirit as God's Administrator.

CP 102 — Gifts of The Holy Spirit

A complete study of the 9 Gifts of the Spirit, their function, power and dispersment.

CP 201 — Principles of Leadership

This course is designated to promote effective leadership in Ministry, both in the Church (House) and in the market-place.

CP 202 — Biblical Principles for Kingdom Finances

This course reveals how the believer should seek to prosper for Kingdom Purposes which results in personal prosperity

CP 203 — Hearing the Voice of God

This course discusses the many ways God speaks. However, His people are not always listening.

CP 204 — How to Heal the Sick

Jesus gave the commission to "Heal the sick". This course is taken completely from the Scriptures giving the illustrations, the commands, and the "How To".

CP 205 — Protected Provision for the Endtimes

A Study of how the believer should expect provision with a collapsing economy and eco system.

CP 301 — Structure & Order of the Church

This course deals with the process of planning and implementing administration in accordance with theological purposes of the church and leadership styles.

CP 304 — The Anti-Christ Kingdom

A look into the kingdom that will be established by the Beast in the book of Revelation and the influence anti-Christ will have in the world.

CP 400 — Song of Solomon

A powerful prophetic study of the transformation of the Believer from servant to authority through the power of truly knowing Jesus as Bridegroom.

CP 401 — Transformation

God has a unique blueprint for our lives, but it is up to us to find it & live it out to its fullest. In this course with the text book you will discover and i=uncover this blueprint.

CP 402 — Expose & Revelation of Christianity, Cults & Religions

This is a study of occult practices such as transcendental meditations, hypnosis, mind-control, astrology, and witchcraft.

CP 403 — Dreams & Visions

This course will enable you to interpret your Night Dreams. Prophet Daniel called them "Night Visions". You will be encouraged to journal your dreams, for many times, they do come to pass just as you dreamed.

New Testament (NT)

NT 101 — Epistles of Paul I

A study of the epistles of Romans through Ephesians.

NT 102 — Epistles of Paul II

A study of the epistles of Philippians through Philemon.

NT 103 — Harmony of the Gospels

This course shows the correlation of the 4 Gospels and the distinctive emphasis of the message in each.

NT 104 — Acts of The Apostles

This is a study of the early church including an overview of the journeys of the early Apostles, their ministries, the effect on society, and their miracles.

NT 201 — Christology

This course is a study of the work, words and life of Christ, His mission and ministry with an emphasis on His redemptive mission in God's plan of salvation for mankind.

Old Testament (OT)

OT 201 — O.T. Major Prophets

This is an exegetical study of the prophetic books of Isaiah, Jeremiah, Lamentations, Ezekiel and Daniel, Judges, Ruth, 1&2 Samuel, 1&2 Kings.

OT 202 — Minor Prophets 1

This is an exegetical study of the minor prophetic books of Hosea, Joel, Amos, Obadiah, Jonah and Micah.

OT 203 - Minor Prophets 2

This is a continued exegetical study of the prophetic books Nahum, Habakkuk, Zephaniah, Haggai, Zechariah and Malachai.

OT 204 — The Feast of The Lord

An overview of each of the O.T. Feasts the Lord instituted and how they were to be carried out and how Christ, The Messiah is the fulfillment.
