

# Aurum Join & Setup Guide

**Start here before creating your account or funding**

Browser access, 2FA security, wallet setup, USDT/USDC funding, and EX-AI Bot deposit basics

## **! Read This First**

This guide is designed to make the setup process easier to understand. It is not financial advice.

## **Quick Checklist**

Before you start, make sure you have these ready:

- A desktop computer is recommended for the easiest setup experience.
- A supported browser/access path based on your location.
- An authenticator app such as Google Authenticator or Microsoft Authenticator.
- A wallet or exchange account that can send USDT or USDC on a supported network.
- A few quiet minutes to carefully confirm the asset, network, and wallet address before sending funds.

## Important Access Note

### 1 If you are in North America

Start with this guide before clicking the registration link. Depending on your location, the registration page may require Tor Browser or a privacy/VPN option to load properly.

If you are unsure whether your location is supported or how to proceed, stop and ask for help before creating or funding an account.

### 2 If you are outside North America

You may be able to use your normal browser and choose your actual country during registration if it is available.

Even if access is simple, still review the wallet, network, 2FA, and funding sections before sending any crypto.

## The 8-Step Setup Flow

Move through these steps in order. The goal is to avoid confusion and reduce the chance of making a crypto transfer mistake.

### 1. Choose your browser/access path

Desktop is usually easiest. Use the access path that applies to your location:

- North America: Tor Browser or another appropriate privacy/VPN option may be needed.
- Desktop Tor Browser: <https://www.torproject.org/download/>
- iPhone option: Onion Browser in the App Store.
- Outside North America: your normal browser may work if your country is available during registration.

### 2. Open the official join link

Open the registration link using the browser/access path that applies to you:

✓ **Tip**

If the page does not load, do not keep guessing. Recheck your browser/access path or book a setup call for help.

### 3. Choose the correct country option

During registration, you may see country fields for phone number and country.

- If you are using the North America access path, choose Crypto Nation (+1) in the Phone Number Country dropdown and use the same option later if asked for your country.
- If you are outside North America and your country is available, choose your correct country.
- Do not rush this step. If you are unsure what to choose, ask before continuing.

### 4. Enable 2FA security

After the account is created, enable two-factor authentication (2FA). You can use Google Authenticator, Microsoft Authenticator, or another authenticator app you already trust.

**! Security Tip**

Save your backup/recovery codes somewhere safe.

If you lose access to your authenticator app, these codes may be needed to recover access to your account.

### 5. Prepare your wallet or exchange

Before sending funds, make sure your wallet or exchange can send one of the supported assets on a network shown inside Aurum.

- Supported asset examples commonly include USDT TetherUS and USDC USD Coin.
- Network options can vary by wallet, exchange, and Aurum top-up screen.
- Never assume two networks are the same because the asset name looks similar.

### **! Most Important Funding Rule**

The asset, network, and wallet address must all match before you send funds.

USDT on BEP20 is not the same as USDT on TRC20 or ERC20. If you are not 100% sure, stop and ask for help before sending.

## **6. Top up your Aurum account**

Inside Aurum, go to:

### **Finance > Top-up**

Select the asset you want to use, such as USDT or USDC.

Choose the exact network that matches the wallet or exchange you are sending from.

Copy the wallet address carefully and confirm every detail before sending.

Optional safety step: if your wallet or exchange allows it and fees make sense, consider sending a small test transfer first before sending a larger amount.

## **7. Wait for the transfer to arrive**

After sending, give the network time to process the transaction. Then refresh your Aurum dashboard and confirm the funds appear in your Main balance.

- Some networks are faster than others.
- Do not create a deposit until the funds are visible in your Main balance.
- If the transfer is delayed, check the transaction status in your sending wallet or exchange.

## 8. Create your EX-AI Bot deposit

Once your funds are visible in your Main balance, you can review the EX-AI Bot proposal and decide whether to create a deposit.

1. Click Financial Proposals.
2. Click Ex-AI Bot.
3. Click Create Deposit.
4. The system may first have you pay the platform access fee, which is about \$20.
5. After the access fee is complete, go back to Financial Proposals > Ex-AI Bot and click Create Deposit again.
6. Choose your amount. You may see a Max option to move available funds from Main balance into the deposit.
7. Review the rules carefully, accept only if you understand them, then click Create Deposit.

### **! Final Reminder Before Depositing**

Only create a deposit if you understand the platform rules and are comfortable with the risk.

Past performance does not guarantee future results. Do not use money you cannot afford to risk.

## Funding Safety Rules

Crypto transfers are usually irreversible. Use this checklist before every transfer:

1. Confirm the asset: USDT and USDC are different assets.
2. Confirm the network: BEP20, TRC20, ERC20, Polygon, and other networks are not interchangeable.
3. Confirm the address: copy/paste carefully and check the first and last characters.
4. Confirm your sending wallet has enough network-fee balance, such as BNB for BNB Smart Chain.
5. When in doubt, stop and ask for help before sending.

## Common Wallet Examples

These examples are only general guidance. Wallet support and network availability can change. Always rely on what your sending wallet/exchange and the Aurum top-up screen show at the time you send.

### **Coinbase / Coinbase App**

USDC on Polygon may be a good option when available.

Confirm the exact network in both Coinbase and Aurum before sending.

### **MetaMask**

USDT on BNB Smart Chain / BEP20 is commonly used.

Make sure MetaMask is set to BNB Smart Chain and that you have enough BNB for network fees.

### **Trust Wallet**

Trust Wallet supports many USDT and USDC network options.

Choose the exact asset and network shown in Aurum. Do not guess.
