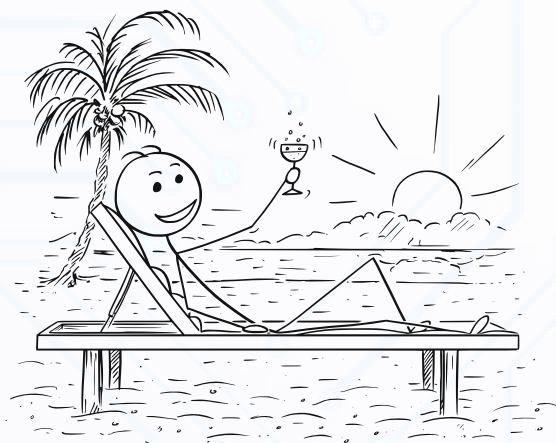

- “Write a 500-word report on the impact of remote work, including productivity statistics and employee satisfaction trends.”

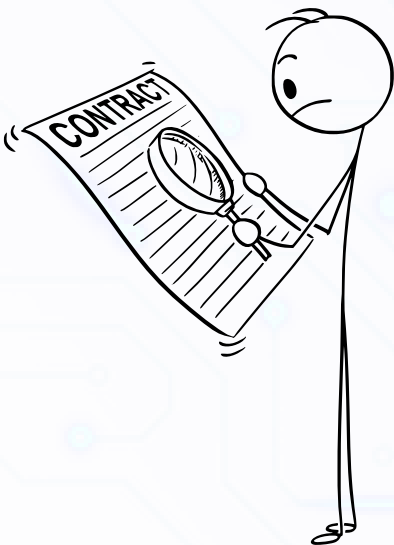
2. **Revising:** Provide feedback:

Embedding Tone and Voice

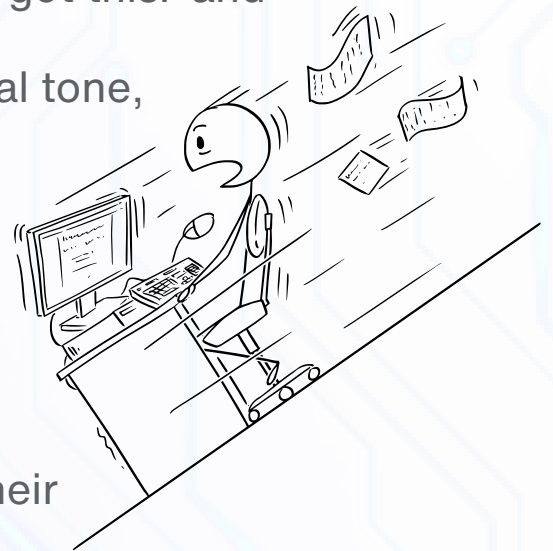
You can guide AI to write in specific tones, styles, or voices:

Simulating Scenarios and Personas

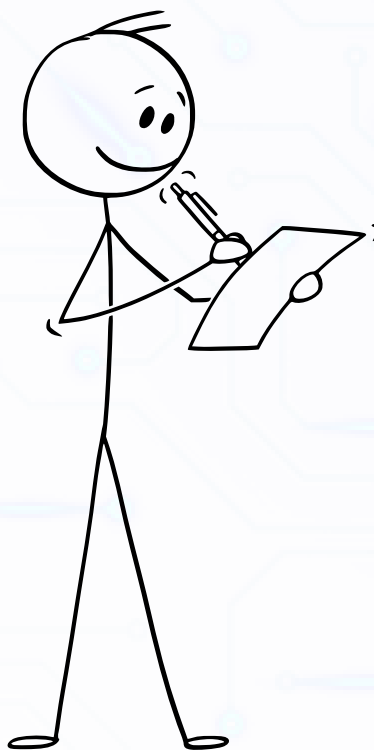
AI can take on roles to provide perspective or simulate scenarios:
