We've got to raise money for this specialized need that wasn't part of our budget. We've got to get protection through security for her and legal counsel to pursue the justice aspect. And through the body of Christ coming together, meeting these needs, we really were able to show her God's love and how He was able to redeem this horrible tragedy.

You know what? Nora has seen Jesus, and the love of Jesus has opened her eyes. You know, a few months after Nora came to live in our restoration center, it was interesting that in one of our studies, the girl's studies at the home, she said that before all this happened, she actually felt like a slave, that she was dead inside, and she had no life. We're talking, this is all before this super horrific evil stuff happened.

Now after all this, she actually says she feels free. Who can do that? Only Jesus can redeem the worst types of evil men want to do. Hey, Nora's story isn't over.

As wonderful as everything that has happened as far as the redemption of this, her surgeries, her healing, and her newfound faith, there's still an evil man out there, a wealthy businessman in Cambodia that has been hiding. This wicked, wicked evil man who did this to her, we're actually pursuing him, and have been. And now we're working with the full force of the Cambodian government, law enforcement officials, to find and bring this man to justice.
