If You've Asked This Question, You're Not Alone

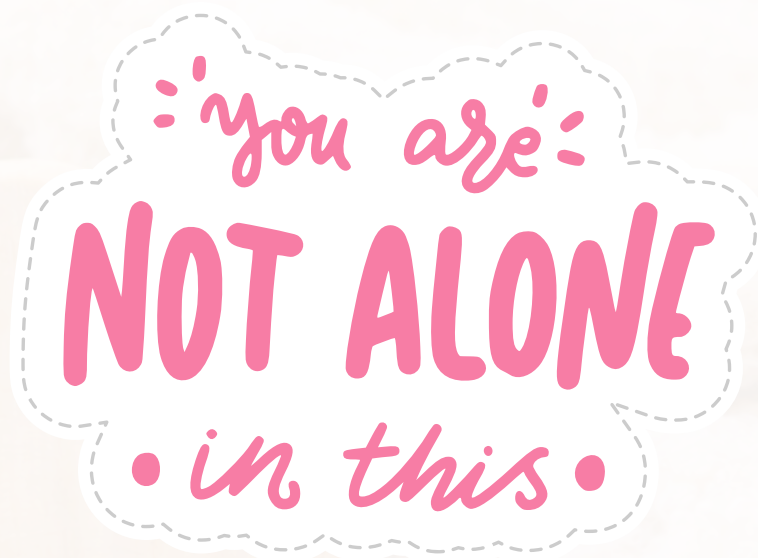
If you've ever quietly wondered, "Am I doing enough?" — please know you are not the only one who has felt this way.

The small, ordinary moments matter more than you think.

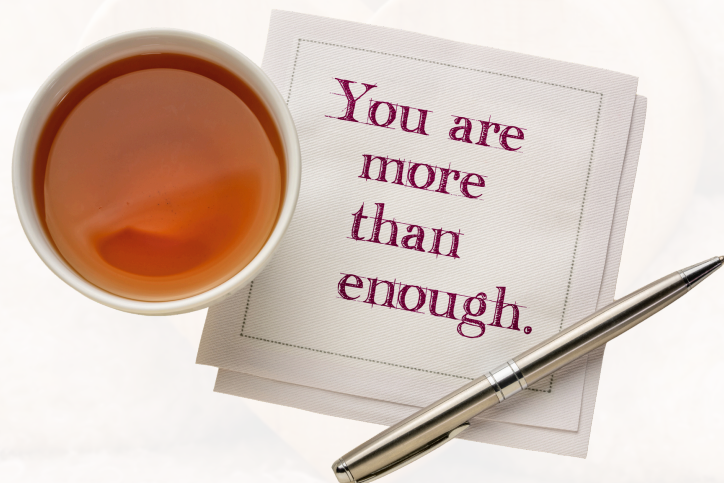
The conversations.
