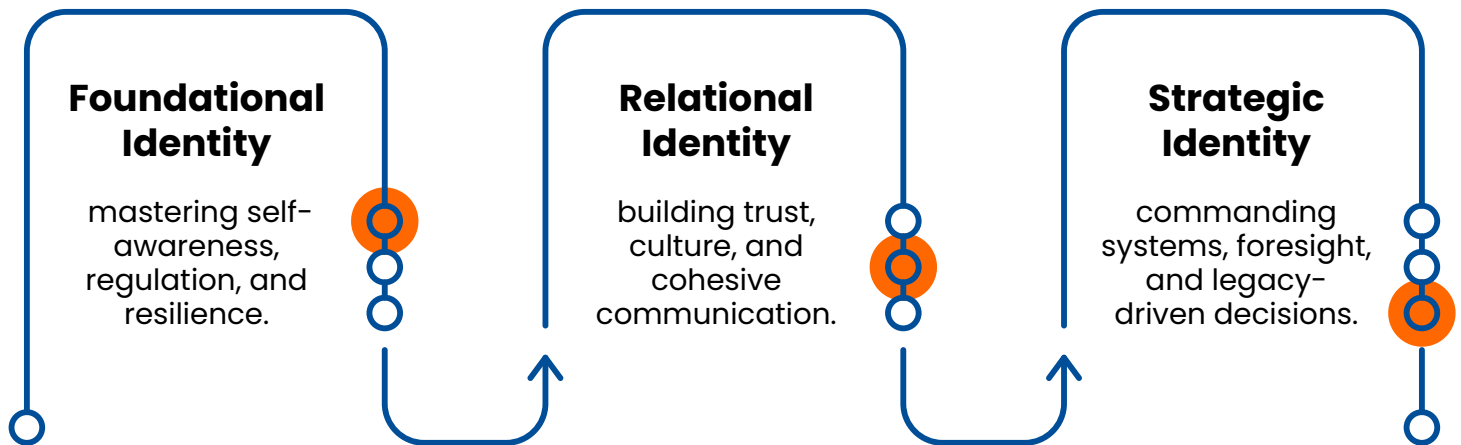
# Outcome
