

HOW TO PLAY BARRY COUNTY JUNIOR GOLF LEAGUE

The Barry County Junior Golf League (BCJG League) uses a **two-person scramble format** for all competitions throughout the season.

BCJG LEAGUE MATCH PLAY

All league play is conducted using a **match play scoring system**. Below are key terms and concepts to help players and families understand how competition works within the league.

GAME. A Game is a competition between two BCJG League teams. Each team fields multiple players, who are grouped into two- or three-player pairings (pairs). These pairs compete head-to-head against pairs from the opposing team.

MATCH. Within each Game, pairs compete in individual Matches.

- A Match is played over 6 or 9 holes, depending on the players' age and experience.
 - Coaches are responsible for assigning players to pairs and determining the appropriate Match length.

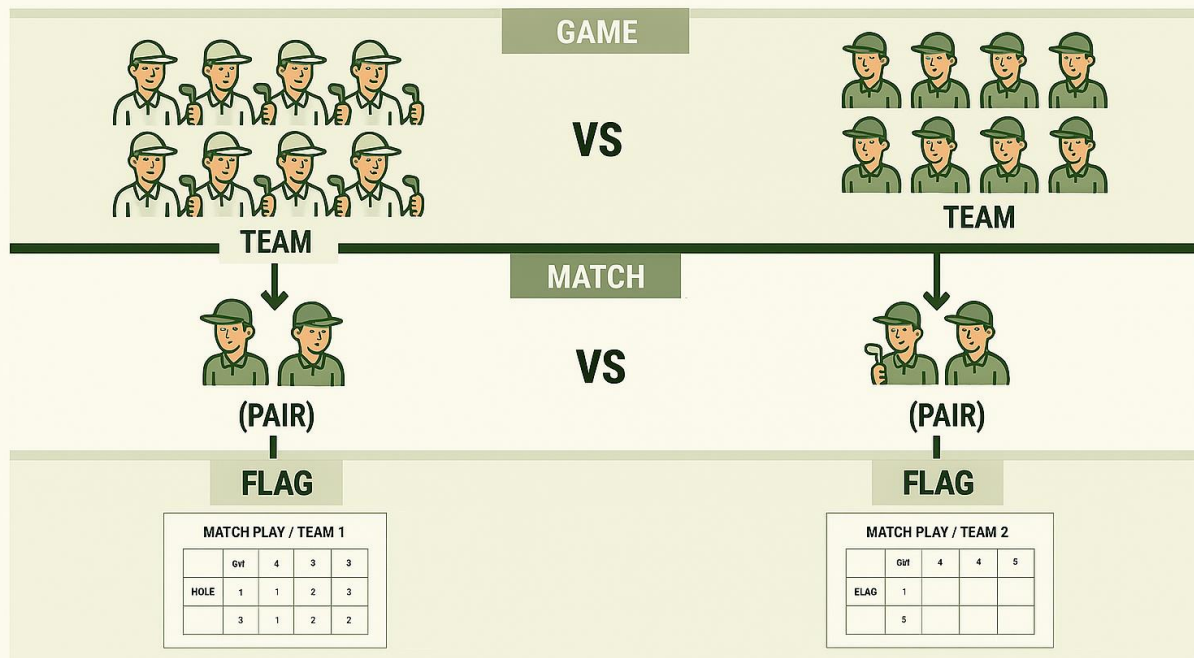
POINTS (Flags). Each Match is divided into three segments called Points (or Flags).

- Each Point consists of the culmination of 3 consecutive holes.
- Matches are therefore structured as three mini-competitions within the overall round.

If a pair includes three players, each player will rotate participation so that:

- Each player competes in 2 of the 3 Points (6 total holes).

ADDITIONAL MATCH PLAY SCORING INFORMATION

- As in traditional match play, each hole is won by the team with the lowest score.
- The team that wins more holes in a point, wins that point, and wins one point.
- If a point ends in a tie, then each team will be awarded a half-point.
- The team with the most points at the end of the game is determined to be the winner.
- Regardless of a win or loss, each team retains their total points won in a game towards their season total.
- The score for each match will be kept by the official markers. Head Coaches will assign individuals to be official markers.
