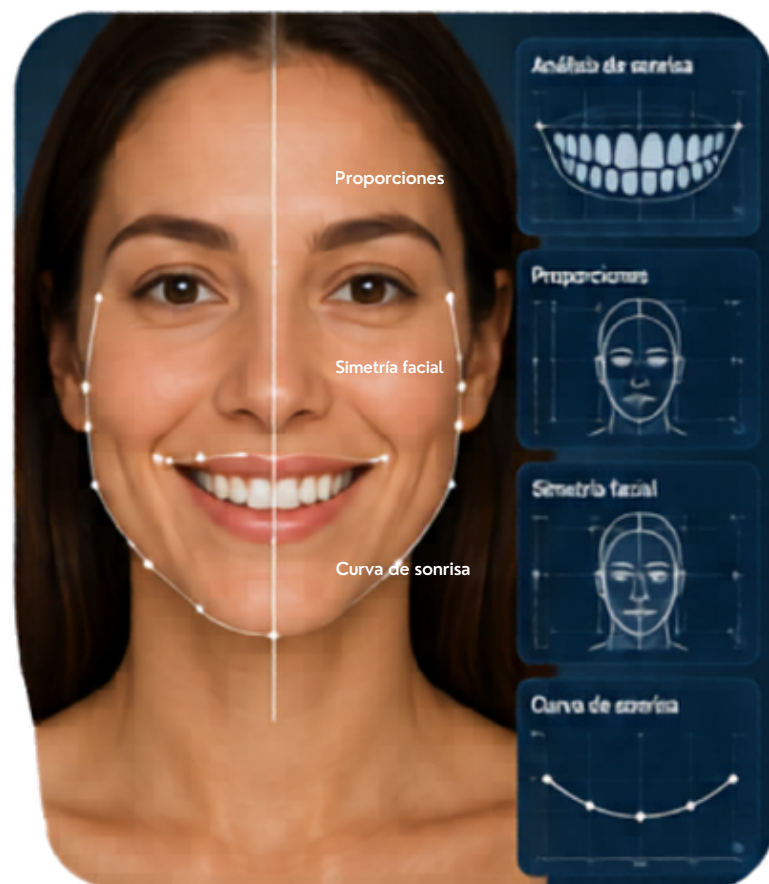
Application 5

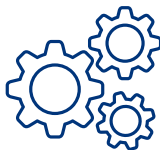

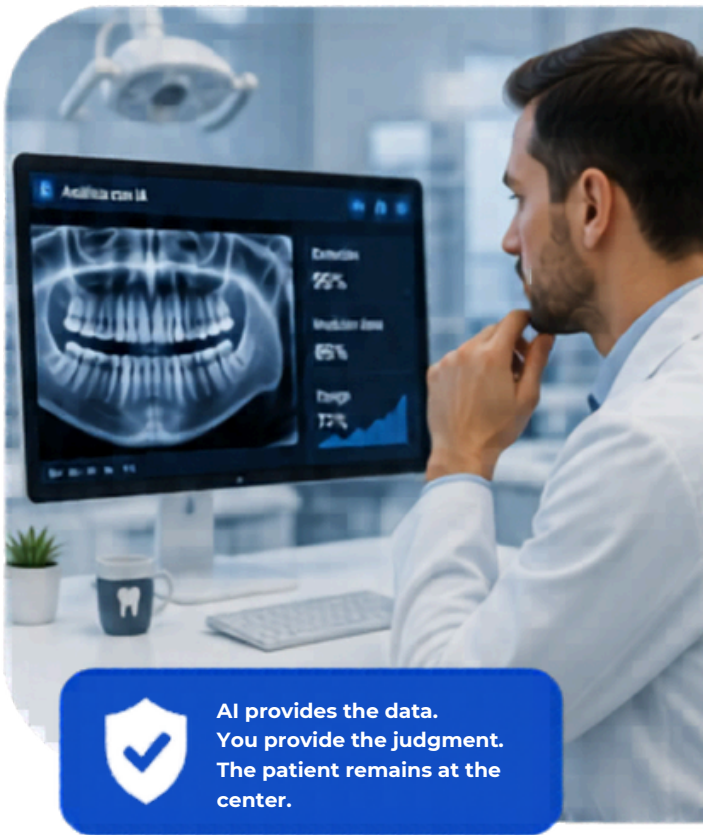
Application 7
