

NEVADA FIL-AMS REPRESENTED AS APAICS LEGISLATIVE LEADERSHIP SUMMIT OPENS IN WASHINGTON

WASHINGTON — The 2026 APAICS Legislative Leadership Summit opens today in the nation's capital, bringing together nonprofit executives, corporate partners, policy experts, and elected officials for two days of discussions on issues shaping Asian American and Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander communities across the country.

Hosted by the Asian Pacific American Institute for Congressional Studies, the summit focuses on policy trends, demographic shifts, economic mobility, immigration, health equity, and the growing political influence of AANHPI communities.

Panels throughout the day are examining the need for culturally competent services, equitable resource allocation, and stronger representation in government and media.

This year, the Asian Community Development Council (ACDC) and One APIA Nevada are ensuring Nevada has a strong presence in these national conversations. Through their civic-leadership initiative, the EducAsian program, the organizations have brought a cohort of Nevada's AANHPI business and community leaders to Washington, D.C., to participate in the summit. The delegation reflects the state's rapidly expanding Asian American population and the increasing importance of preparing community advocates for public-service pathways.

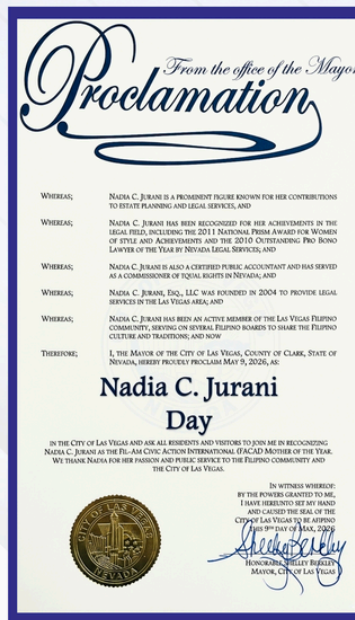

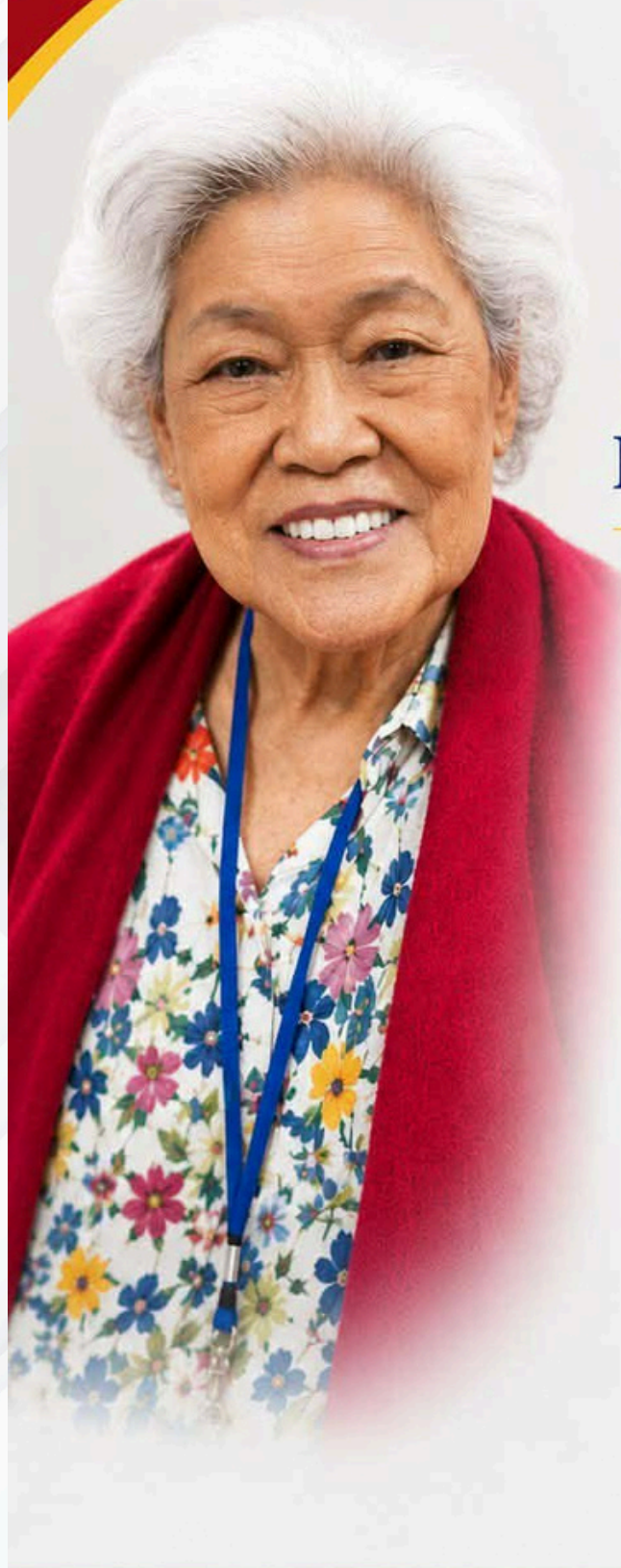
