Questions for Personal Reflection and Group Discussion

1. Read Genesis 11:1-9 and Deuteronomy 32:8-9.

What was the building plan the people made and what were the motives behind it?

How did God respond to the plans and purposes of the people? Why did He disrupt their project? What was wrong with their goal?

Compare the descriptions of God's actions in both the Genesis passage and Deuteronomy 32:8-9. What do you learn about God and the way He worked (and still works) in history?

To whom did God give oversight of the scattered peoples of the world?

2. Read Ezekiel 28:2.

How is the prince of Tyre described? What similarities do you see between him, the people of Babel, and humanity before the flood?

What does this tell you about the natural inclination of the human heart?

3. Read Psalm 82:1-7.

Who is God talking to in this passage and what is He telling them to do?

What is the reason for God's judgment? What will be the result?

4. Read Acts 17:26-27 and Ephesians 6:12.

What does the Apostle Paul say about the nations of the world and God's plan in creating them?

In what way does connecting the dots through scripture give you a better understanding of God and a deeper trust in His sovereignty?

In what ways do you see the Church pushing back the darkness in the world? Are you actively and intentionally a part of that battle? If so, in what ways? If not, what could you do to change that?

5. Read Genesis 12:1-3.

Who does God intend to bless through Abram's family? How does this promise to Abram connect to what we've already learned about God's plan for humanity?

6. Read Revelation 7:9.

What will be the great culmination of God's plan and who is involved? What hope does this give you about the future?
