



# From Capable to Fluent: The Admin Pro's Digital Roadmap

Most admin pros are digitally **capable** – they know their tools. Fewer are digitally **fluent** – the tools bend to them. That gap is what separates the people who stay stuck from the ones who grow into senior, higher-paid roles. Here's the progression, the skills and tools at each stage, and the milestone that moves you up. Find your stage in the rubric at the end.

## L1 Functional

You use the tools you were handed, the way you were shown. You get the job done, but tech is something you cope with, not command. New features feel like extra work.

### BUILD THESE SKILLS

Keyboard shortcuts, search instead of scroll, basic templates, saving files where you can find them again.

### LIVE IN THESE TOOLS

Your calendar, inbox, and one doc/spreadsheet tool – used well, not fully.

**Milestone to L2:** You stop doing one repetitive thing by hand and set up a template or shortcut for it instead.

## L2 Capable

You know your core tools well and use their real features – rules, filters, templates, formulas. You're the person others ask "how do I do this in \_\_\_?" You react fast and rarely get stuck.

### BUILD THESE SKILLS

Inbox rules & triage, calendar management, intermediate spreadsheet formulas, reusable doc templates, first real AI use for drafting.

### LIVE IN THESE TOOLS

Outlook/Gmail power features, a project tool (Asana/Notion), an AI assistant for drafts.

**Milestone to L3:** You build your first repeatable system – not a one-off, but a documented workflow that runs the same way every time.

## L3 Fluent

You don't just use tools – you connect them into systems. Repeated situations no longer take repeated effort. You document how you work so it can be handed off. AI is part of your workflow, used with judgment.

### BUILD THESE SKILLS

Workflow design, SOP writing, light automation, evaluating a new tool before adopting it, prompting well, knowing what's safe to put in AI.

### LIVE IN THESE TOOLS

Automation (Zapier/Make or built-in), a documentation home, AI integrated into real tasks.

**Milestone to L4:** Others start adopting a system you designed – and you're the one advising on which tools the team should use.

## L4 Force-Multiplier / AI Translator

You raise the whole team's digital game. You decide what to build, what to automate, and where AI fits – and where it doesn't. Leadership turns to you on "should we use AI for this?" You've moved from doing the work to designing how the work gets done.

### BUILD THESE SKILLS

Systems thinking, change management, tool strategy, responsible-AI judgment, teaching and rollout.

### LIVE IN THESE TOOLS

Whatever the team needs – you choose them on purpose, and you can justify each one.

**Beyond L4:** This is where digital fluency becomes career capital – senior operations roles, real influence, and pay that reflects it.
