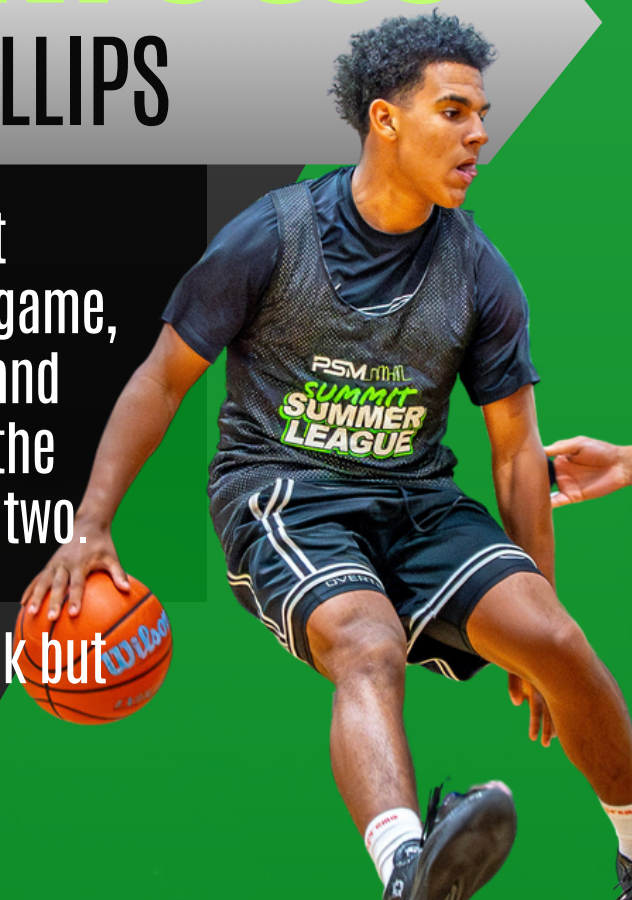

PLAYER FOCUS MALAKI CHRISTIAN

Christian has been a consistent presence this year in his 2nd SSL. He is averaging 7 ppg with two games scoring 8 and two scoring 6 across two weeks. His offensive production is in the top half of the league, using his saavy to get to the basket and a high arching shot to finish off his scoring opportunities.



LEAGUE RULES

WHAT TO KNOW ABOUT THE SSL

Two halves, the first with a 20 minute running clock and the second with an 18 minute running clock.

The Clock will stop for all whistles only in the last minute of each of the halves.

A shot clock that runs for 30 seconds.

Each team gets two 30 second timeouts per game.

Bonus kicks in at 7 team fouls per half. Free throws are shot in their entirety.

Each player gets five personal fouls per game.

All other IHSAA rules apply.

When the clock ends in the second half, the Elam Ending* is in effect, meaning no overtimes.

WHAT IS THE ELAM ENDING?

Popularized in the TBT and the NBA G League, after the game clock ends in the second half, we go to the Elam Ending and time is no longer an element in winning the game. The team that wins is the team that reaches the TARGET SCORE first.

The TARGET SCORE is calculated by adding 7 points to the score of the team that is ahead when time runs out in the second half. Reach the target score and win the game.
