5. TEAM DEVELOPMENT PRIORITIES FOR NEXT SEASON

1. Command & Free Pass Reduction

The pitching staff conceded **157 walks and 32 hit batters** across 150.2 innings (**7.53 free passes per 6 IP**).

- **First-Pitch Strikes:** Target raising staff first-pitch strike % above 60% to force weak contact.
- **Arm-Side Run Control:** Tyler Cooper (#2) hit 11 batters and Mason Brooks (#7) hit 7. Pitchers must learn to miss off the outside edge rather than arm-side inside to righties.

2. Two-Strike Approach & Slugger Contact

While team batting was strong (.441 AVG), strikeouts clustered in key power bats (Parker 22.9%, Hayes 25.0%, Miller 20.7%).

- **Choke-Up & Battle Drills:** Implement 2-strike counts in live batting practice to expand zone awareness and reduce whiffs.
- **Opposite-Field Contact:** Teach middle-order hitters to drive outer-half pitches to opposite gaps with two strikes.

3. Infield Throwing Footwork & Routine Assist Execution

Across 510 fielding chances, the roster tallied 448 putouts but only **15 assists against 47 errors (.908 FPCT)**. At youth levels, inaccurate throws cause most multi-base errors. Offseason infield training must drill footwork alignment toward first base, crisp glove transfers, and aggressive outfield cut-off positioning.

6. ROSTER OPTIMIZATION: TARGETED PLAYER DEVELOPMENT & POSITIONAL DEPTH NEEDS

Targeted Player Development & Growth Plans

- **Dylan Foster (#3) — Mechanical & Command Focus:** Showed solid outfield reliability (.889 FPCT) with key growth opportunities in contact power (.410 SLG) and pitching command (48.1% Strike Rate, 7.00 FP/6). Offseason priorities center on lower-half rotational power in the cage and flat-ground fastball command drills to attack the bottom of the zone.
- **Austin Hayes (#14) — Contact Rate & Gap Pop:** Displayed elite speed on the bases (30 SB) and great outfield defense (.933 FPCT). Winter development should prioritize shortening his swing path with two strikes to reduce whiffs and convert his high OBP (.480) into extra-base gap line drives.
- **Roster Continuity & Winter Clinic Pathways:** For athletes who stepped away after the Fall season (Brody Hayes, Gavin Ross, Cooper Mason, Hunter Price), recommend targeted high-rep winter development clinics to build arm strength and fundamental mechanics for future competitive seasons.

Positional Reinforcements & Strategic Additions

- **True #1/2 Strike-Throwing Pitcher:** The staff leaned heavily on Brooks (30.0 IP) and Davis (22.2 IP). Bringing in an additional strike-thrower (≥ 60% Strike Rate) will distribute deep Sunday bracket innings and ensure long-term arm safety.
- **Defensive Specialist Catcher:** Parker and Mitchell caught substantial innings, but Parker's premier bat (.957 SLG) benefits from routine physical rest behind the plate. A dedicated defensive catcher with quick pop time is an ideal target.
- **Impact Middle-Infield Depth:** Adding a versatile natural shortstop or second baseman will allow Jackson Reed and Mason Brooks to pitch without compromising middle infield defensive range.
